Job Purpose:

Zeitgeist is looking for engaged members of the Hillside community to join a team dedicated to working with Hillside residents to identify community challenges and build neighborhood-driven solutions to uplift the health and wellbeing of all. This particular role would have a focus on identifying barriers to mobility as well as developing opportunities for Hillside community members to learn, connect, and advocate around people-powered transportation, safe streets, and green space.

Primary Duties & Responsibilities:

- Attend monthly team meetings, and other meetings/training opportunities as needed to share information, develop skills, and move the work forward.
- Participate in and lead community engagement activities including community conversations, educational events, and art and storytelling initiatives.
- Work independently, in teams, and with community partners to conduct the work.
- Research, report back, and present on community input and success stories.
- Plan, and implement action steps to address community wellbeing.
- As applicable, attend and participate in meetings related to transportation topics including City Council, County and City Commissions, School Board, and other public meetings.



Qualifications:

This team is a broad representation of the Hillside neighborhood, therefore we are looking to reflect a variety of communities, and especially those who are systemically under-represented. In particular, BIPOC, elders, LGBTQAI+, people with disabilities, and low-income community members are encouraged to apply.

Required Experience:

- Live, lived, or work in the Duluth Hillside neighborhood
- Working relationships with Hillside communities most impacted by health inequities
- Basic proficiency with, or willingness to learn, Google docs, Microsoft Word, online meeting platforms, and other standard technology tools
- Internet access, as needed, for online meetings and trainings

Preferred Experience:

- Desire and history of working with diverse audiences (including gender, race, sexual orientation, ability, age, class, and education level) and in collaborative teams
- Interest or past experiences in connecting Hillside residents to resources and information about health and wellbeing
- Familiarity with agencies and organizations that provide supportive community resources
- Familiarity with or willingness to learn about topics to support wellbeing including health equity, neighborhood design, active transportation, and sustainable infrastructure
- Familiarity with Duluth's transportation services and networks, including the Duluth Transit Authority, or personal experience navigating the city by bus, walking, or biking
- Interest or experience using art (visual, narrative, performance, or video), design, and creative placemaking to communicate, educate, and facilitate community input

Job Status & Salary:

This position is a part time, independent contractor position with Zeitgeist. Contractors receive a 1099 each year for tax purposes. This position is effective immediately at \$18/hour. It is approximately 2-7 hours per week, with a variety of virtual and in-person outreach, meetings, and presentations as well as some independent work (all activities follow COVID-19 safety practices).
